## Call for help to save 22 dogs

The pictures below are examples of a group of 22 huskies (yes, 22) that are in desperate need of new homes. These dogs belong to a man who lives near High Prairie, Alberta. Apparently, he can no longer care for them and has offered to surrender them to rescue groups. If they are not claimed, this man will ask the municipality to shoot them. He is moving away so time is of the essence.

Prairie Animal Rescue Society (PARS) is taking the lead on this rescue, and SCARS is trying to assist, but we can only accommodate a few of these dogs. We simply don't have space to foster all 22 – hence we are sending out this **URGENT** call for help!

Here's some information about the dogs. They:

- are Alaskan style which means they are cross bred to make them better sled dogs.
- are friendly (especially with other dogs), and they range in age from 1 to 7 years old (mostly males).
- have energy levels that range from low to high, depending on age.
- are grey and white in colour (most of them)
- have been living outdoors and they will require training. For example, they were taught to pull so they need time to adjust to leash walking.

Terra, the President of PARS, is hoping they will all be placed before August 4. Her concern is there will be no one to check on them during her planned absence from August 4 to 12. REMEMBER, the owner is trying to do the right thing, but he could change his mind at any time and decide to have these beautiful animals shot.
